The Ebony Hillbillies

The Princeton Folk Music Society presents The Ebony Hillbillies - the last African-American String Band in America - playing pop, country, bluegrass, folk, jazz.

The 1930's recordings of The Mississippi Sheiks and the *Altamont: Recordings of Black Stringband Music* inspired Henrique Prince - classical violinist/vocalist and Norris Washington Bennett - string instrumentalist and vocalist. String band music became a mission. They began playing on street corners and soon were joined by others to form a band.

String band music is both melancholic, born of deprivation and disappointment, and joyful. In the 18th and 19th centuries, African American string bands were an essential part of daily life - playing for pleasure, for church, to relieve the enormous stresses of plantation life. And they played for dances.
