Phil Ochs Song Night

The Princeton Folk Music Society presents a celebration of the music of Phil Ochs (1940 – 1976), core member of the Greenwich Village folk music movement. He is known for civil rights and protest songs such as "I Ain't Marching Anymore."

In 1983, Suzanne Vega, Melanie, Tom Paxton, Christine Lavin, and Dave Van Ronk honored him by creating a Phil Ochs Song Night. Initially limited to Phil's songs, over time performers included some originals.

Four musicians carry on this tradition. Reggie Harris, fluid vocalist and guitarist, creates an atmosphere that rewards the ears.

Greg Greenway blends Richie Havens' passion, James Taylor's lyrical guitar, and Peter Gabriel's rhythm and politics.

Pat Wictor, an innovative slide guitarist, adds fresh interpretations of traditional and contemporary songs.

Louise Mosrie, classically trained singer with a big pop voice, adds original, award-winning Americana songs.
