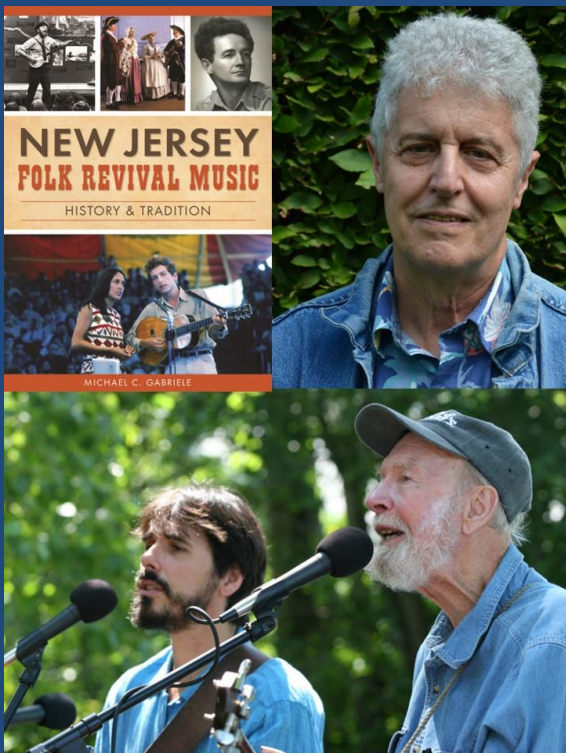

## Michael Gabriele / Spook Handy

The Princeton Folk Music Society presents a night of folk music history. Author, journalist, and freelance writer Gabriele traces the evolution of NJ folk music from 1700s bawdy tavern songs, through Pine Barrens bluegrass and old-time traditions to contemporary folk music. The Garden State's regional and cultural diversity infused its language, imagery, personality, and rhythm into songs that are part of the folk revival canon.

Spook Handy performed in over 50 concerts with Pete Seeger. He sings and retells many of the songs and stories learned during this time. His program keeps Seeger's tradition of singing songs with social value as a tool to build and nurture community alive. It is a celebration of Seeger's legacy.

Gabriele - published five books on NJ history. He serves on the executive boards of the NJ Folk Festival, Allied Artists of America, and Nutley Historical Society.

Handy - *Pete, Woody & Me - Keep the Flame Alive* – a CD of songs that influenced Seeger, that Seeger wrote, plus songs written by Handy.
